

THE IMMEDIATE FUTURE

To form the immediate future (also known as the future with *aller* or *le futur proche*) (for example, we are going to), take the present tense of *aller* and then add the infinitive of the appropriate verb e.g. *nous allons passer un mois à Paris* – we are going to spend a month in Paris.
